



Penalties, fines & confiscations

Unfortunately, breaking the rules will attract a penalty ranging from cart confiscation to a fine.

PRINCE'S GRANT GOLF CART POLICY

PRINCE'S GRANT. THE WAY LIFE SHOULD BE LIVED.

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Policy Overview

This policy is aimed at ensuring that the philosophy of Prince's Grant - "The way life should be lived" is maintained whilst ensuring safety to all.

The Home Owners Association/Golf Club/Lodge will not be held liable for loss, damage, injury or death resulting from the use of a golf cart on the estate.

Policy Fundamentals

- This policy applies to all golf carts on the estate.
- The rules of the road must be obeyed at all times.

Pre-requisites for a golf cart to be driven on the estate

- Golf carts must be registered and all fees paid.
- Golf carts will display the required identification as stated in the policy.
- Trail/Insurance fee must be paid to the Homeowners Association on a yearly basis. This payment allows for the trail fee, liability, and third party insurance. A cart may not be driven on the estate without this permit.

- Golf carts may be driven by anyone between the ages of thirteen and eighteen or anyone in possession of a code 08 licence.
- Drivers between the age of thirteen and eighteen will need to pass a written and practical examination conducted by the Golf Director (rules and test details available separately). This applies to home owners and tenants. Tenants should book a test appointment with the golf director 24 hours in advance by contacting the pro-shop.
- All homeowners carts to have front and rear lights fitted for night usage.
- Homeowners who rent their properties with a golf cart must ensure that tenants are aware of the rules.
- These specially licensed drivers, must have their "cart drivers licence" with them when driving the cart.

Number sticker	Placed on the front of the cart on the drivers side below the seat
Trail/Insurance fee sticker	Placed directly under the number sticker on the drivers side
Golf Cart usage rules sticker	In the roof - close to the front
